

The Festival of Lights

Diwali, or *Deepavali*, will fall on Sunday, October 30th this year and will be celebrated by Hindus all over the world. For us, the Hindu Americans, this is the time of the year when the lights come on and signal the beginning of the festive season, followed by Halloween, Thanksgiving, Hanukkah, Christmas and finally, the New Year. Traditionally, we turn the lights on after Thanksgiving and keep it going for a week after the 1st of January. But this year, I think we will start earlier, with Diwali, and continue the same tradition.

And what do we celebrate?

Simply put, we celebrate the victory of good over evil, of light over darkness, of clarity of understanding over confusion, of good-heartedness over meanness. We celebrate the victory of good intentions in ourselves over the bondage that we create for ourselves through our unthinking habits. Diwali is the time of renewing ourselves, of new beginnings.

For those of us who are young in years, it is the time of dreaming, of visions of the future and the articulation of our intentions. For those of us who count several decades behind us, it is returning to our good intentions and reaffirming them.

There are countless legends which seek to explain the origins of Deepavali. In Northern India, it is believed to be the day when Sri Rama was crowned Emperor after his return from exile. In Kerala, it is believed to be the day when Emperor Bali, who was allowed to visit his erstwhile kingdom just for one day in the year, it is welcomed by his grateful subjects. The Lord had trampled him down into the nether regions, as a punishment for his egoistic tyrannical expansive program of conquest but He melted a little when Bali pleaded for mercy, and allowed him to return to earth for just one day out of the 365 days in the year. On that day, his subjects could welcome him with illumination and fireworks.

The most widely current among the legends refers to the demon Naraka whom Lord Krishna, along with Sathyabhama, destroyed in battle on this day. Naraka was the son of Mother Earth, as the story goes, of Bhoo Mata. She asked for a boon from the Lord, that this day should be observed in his memory, as a Day of Light or Joy and the sharing of joy by one and all.

Therefore, hundreds of tiny lamps are lit this evening and kept in rows before and within every home. But, even when doing this attention has to be paid to the discarding of worn-out prejudices, the adoption of new habits of love and mutual respect, the hanging of festoons of friendship over the door sill of the heart.

So do not let this year's Diwali go by with putting out merely the outward symbols of light; seize the day to renew yourself, once again, and be all you can truly be.
